A. COVID-19

The event will adhere to all health and legal directions in force during the event and may require QR code sign-in, social distancing, wearing of masks, limit group sizes, mandatory vaccination and other requirements as mandated by the Australian and/or Western Australian Department of Health. B. Rules & Definitions

The regatta will be governed by:

- the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) (2021 2024) Windsurfing Fleet Racing Rules (Appendix B)
 - No National Authority prescriptions will apply.
- 2. the Windsurfer Class rules.

If there is conflict between the Notice of Race (NOR) and the Sailing Instructions (SIs), the SIs will take precedence.

If there is a conflict between languages, the English text will take precedence.

C - Rule 42. - Propulsion (Pumping)

As per Windsurfer Class rules, Rule 42 is changed to:

"A board shall be propelled only by the action of the wind on the sail, by the action of the water on the hull and by the unassisted actions of the competitor except that when:

(i) Course racing

and competitors are sailing to <u>windward or on a close-hauled course</u>, pumping (continuous and/or repetitive movement of the rig to induce wind-flow over the sail) <u>is prohibited except for the first 30</u> <u>seconds after the starting signal</u>, at which time a horn will sound and pumping whilst sailing on an upwind course is no longer permitted.

A member of the race committee or a designated observer who sees a competitor infringing these pumping restrictions may disqualify a competitor without a hearing.

Note: Pumping is unrestricted for the slalom and marathon events.

D. Eligibility

Windsurfer Class boards of the Windsurfer LT type using class supplied and approved equipment. All competitors <u>shall:</u>

- 1. Be paid up members of their National or Regional Windsurfer Class Association.
- 2. For Australian competitors the NCA is the Windsurfer Class Association of Australia (WCAA)
- 3. Have current Australian Windsurfing Association (AWA) 3rd party liability insurance, (included in the entry fee for international sailors).
- 4. Have a unique sail number, displayed in accordance with the Windsurfer Class Rules.

E. Entry Fee & Registration

Competitors will pay the prescribed entry fees as detailed below.

The event entry fee includes racing, event merchandise, social events and presentation. Two social events are included with sailor registration. These include a meal but not drinks. Additional tickets (\$35.00 per event) for friends and family are available for purchase. **No entries will be accepted after 11.59pm on December 1, 2023**. An additional **late entry fee** of AUD\$100.00 applies to **entries received after October 31, 2023**.

F. Charter Boards



The Australian Windsurfer LT distributor – "Windgenuity Sailboards" will provide charter boards. One hundred (100) charter boards are available for <u>International Non-Australian residents only</u>. These will be allocated on a "first come first served" basis. Charters will be open from May 3rd. The deadline for Charter application is October 15th, 2023.

The Charter boards will be brand new, supplied complete and will have pre-applied sail numbers.

G. Registration

All competitors shall complete registration with the Organising Authority on December 29th 2023. At Registration:

- 1. All competitors will have to sign an Entry Form which includes the Entry Declaration and Disclaimer of Liability;
- 2. All competitors will have their Windsurfer Class and Insurance status checked;
- 3. Competitors under 18 years of age must have an 'Emergency Contact Form' and 'Media Consent Form', completed by their parent / guardian;
- 4. Male competitors will have their weight recorded;
- 5. Proof of age of a competitor will be checked, if required by the Organising Authority

Registration will occur at SoPYC between 0900 and 1800hrs on Friday, December 29th 2023.

The event will be run on an 'on call' basis.

Competitors are strongly advised not to leave the vicinity of SoPYC during racing sessions as decisions to race may be made quickly based on changing conditions or racing requirements.

Decisions will be made by the Organising Authority based on safety, conditions and requirements to complete each of the four competition disciplines.

Competitors will be briefed before each racing session as to what discipline(s) will be run.

Multiple briefings may be held, and changes may be made through verbal instructions or notices to competitors.

More than one discipline may be run in a racing session, and/or divisions may undertake different disciplines within one racing session.

I. Competition Disciplines

Competition will be conducted in the disciplines of Course Racing, Marathon, Slalom and Freestyle. Target competition program is a minimum nine (9) Course Races, one (1) Marathon, one (1) complete round of slalom and one (1) Freestyle event.

J. Competition Divisions

Racing will be conducted for Women Men – A. Light / B. Medium-Light / C. Medium-Heavy / D. Heavy

Weight Divisions will be allocated by the following method as per Class Rules: Split Weights:

- 1. Male competitors will be divided into up to 4 categories of weight (A-D) of equal numbers, including Youth
- 2. After the weighing procedure, in case the total number cannot be divided by four, the first category with one competitor more will be determined upon a random draw. In case two competitors have the same weight, the younger competitor will be considered the lighter.
- 3. Before the start of the first race, a second weighing procedure may be called for the athletes close to the limits of the categories, in order to recheck the correct registered weight.
- 4. Where there is a significant difference between cut-off weights and/or a number of competitor weights that are close to the limits between divisions, the Organising Authority may, in its absolute discretion, increase or decrease the number of competitors in a division to promote closer and fairer racing.

Weighing Procedure:

- 1. Weighing of competitors will be conducted during the event registration period on the official scales provided by the Organising Authority.
- 2. Competitors will weigh in T-shirt and shorts only (no footwear) with all pockets emptied.
- 3. Competitors may be re-weighed at any time during an event at the discretion of the Organising Authority.
- 4. If subsequent weighing of a competitor indicates a variation of more than 2 kilograms from the original weight that would cause a competitor to change weight division the Organising Authority will assess the circumstances and have the option to change the competitors' division.

K. Equipment

It is the responsibility of each competitor to ensure that their equipment conforms to the current Class Rules.

Equipment inspection may be undertaken at any time during the Event by the Organising Authority to ensure compliance with Class Rules.

Only **one sail may be used in an event**, except when the sail has been lost or unintentionally damaged beyond repair. A replacement may be made **only with a sail of the same size** and with the approval of the Technical Committee.

Sails

(a) 5.7 m2 Windsurfer sail.
(b) 4.5 m2 Windsurfer sail.
(c) 4.0 m2 Windsurfer sail.

L. Sailing Instructions

The Sailing Instructions (SIs) including course format and racing procedure will be available online nolater than 3 days prior to the event.

Further instructions may be provided verbally at Briefings and also by Notices to Competitors. The SIs and Notices to Competitors will be available on the Official Notice Board at SoPYC.

M. Scoring

Scoring will be conducted by division.

For course racing and marathon, the Low Point System - RRS Appendix A Scoring will apply.

Three (3) course races are required to be completed to constitute a series.

When fewer than 5 course races have been completed a board's series course racing score will be the total of her divisional race scores.

When from 5 to 7 course races have been completed, a board's series course racing score will be the total of her divisional race scores excluding her worst score ("one drop").

When 8 or more course races have been completed, a board's series course racing score will be the total of her divisional race scores excluding her two worst scores ("two drops").

Slalom and Freestyle scoring will be as per Class Competition Rules.

Overall scoring will be in accordance with Class Competition Rules and includes Course Racing, Marathon and Slalom. Overall scores will be an aggregate of:

Course Racing : divisional place \underline{plus} the average score of counted races in the division

+

Slalom : divisional place

+

Marathon : divisional place

=

Overall score

Age group positions will be calculated based on the sailor's overall score.

N. Buoyancy

All competitors shall wear whilst racing in course racing, slalom and marathon personal flotation devices which are in good condition and are in accordance with the specifications approved by the National Authority at or above the minimum level required (ie labelled 50N) or as approved by the Organising Authority (changes rules 27.1 and 40.1.) Attention is drawn to rule 1.2.

O. Trophies and Prizes

PRIZES

Course Racing: 1st, 2nd and 3rd (Category: A, B, C, D, Women, Youth)

Long Distance: 1st, 2nd and 3rd (Overall, Youth and Women)

Slalom: 1st, 2nd and 3rd (Overall, Youth and Women)

Freestyle: 1st, 2nd and 3rd Men, 1st, 2nd and 3rd Women.

Overall: 1st, 2nd and 3rd (Overall, Junior, Youth, Master and Grand Master, Legend, Super Legend and Women)

P. Responsibility

Attention is drawn to Fundamental Rule 3 - Decision to Race, which states "The responsibility for a board's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone".

It is the competitor's sole decision to enter this event and to start and or to continue to compete. By way of entering, competitors acknowledge and agree that participation in this event can be dangerous and accept that their participation is at their exclusive risk in every respect. In addition, by way of entering competitors shall hold harmless the Organising Authority, its officers, members, servants and agents and all other competitors in respect of all liability for injury to their person and or loss or damage to their property howsoever arising from their participation or intended participation in this event and acknowledge and accept that the organising authority, its officers, members, servants, agents and other competitors accept no responsibility in respect to loss of life, personal injury or loss or damage to property which may be sustained by reason of a competitor's participation or intended participation in this event.

Competitors will sign a disclaimer of liability at registration.

Q. Advertising

Competitors may be obliged by the Organising Authority to display advertising of sponsors on sails and/or other equipment and/or on their persons in accordance with World Sailing Regulation 20.

R. Media Rights

Competitors give full rights and permission to the Organising Authority and / or IWCA for use and broadcasting of photographs or videos of persons or boards competing in the event including, but not limited to, spots on television, online mediums and social media and can be used for editorial purpose, promotion or printed information.

Competitors under 18 years of age may opt out when completing the disclaimer of liability at registration.



Weather

Sailing on Melville Water at this time of the year has a generally light easterly land breeze in the morning followed by an afternoon sea breeze from the south-west called the "Fremantle Doctor" which is usually 10-25 knots.

Frontal systems can disrupt the usual wind pattern.

Ballroom with stage – seats 250, standing 350 (Main Ballroom)


Restaurant and bar - seats 100 (Members Bar and Restaurant)

HOW TO GET THERE

PERTH AIPORT TO SOPYC - TAXI 18km AUD\$45.00 (EUD\$30), 25 minutes.

PERTH AIRPORT TO CITY HOTELS - TRAIN - Exit arrivals hall then take lift to elevated 250 metre walkway to Airport Central Station. the train to Perth City platform 8 - 19 minutes.

PERTH CITY TO SOPYC- TRAIN -Underground station take Mandurah line to Canning Bridge Station – 8 minutes, then a 15 minute flat walk to SOPYC.

PERTH CITY TO COMO HOTELS - BUS - Perth Bus Port to Hotels, Route 30 – 17 minutes, 2 minute walk

COMO HOTELS TO SOPYC - flat walking (40 minutes) and bike paths (15 minutes)

PERTH AIRPORT to UNIVERSITY of WESTERN AUSTRALIA -TAXI - 19km AUD\$45.00 (EUD\$30) 25 minutes, there will be a morning and afternoon boat shuttle from the SOPYC to the University of Western Australia wharf.
